PFSA was honored to testify before the Senate Republican Policy Committee and to work closely with legislators as the bill took shape. Thanks to thoughtful collaboration with Senators Tracy Pennycuick and Scott Martin,

S.B. 1050 now moves to the House with strong momentum and a shared commitment to safeguarding children in a rapidly changing digital world.

### Flag Planting

On April 1, PFSA will once again sponsor this in-person event. From Front Street to the steps of the Capitol, PFSA's staff and board of directors, statewide and local advocates, officials, and corporate supporters will plant 4,756 blue flags to represent the number of

substantiated child abuse cases and 60 black flags to represent the number of child deaths due to child abuse in Pennsylvania over one year.

# UPCOMING PFSA TRAININGS

## Families in Recovery (FiR) New Facilitator Training

This research-based program is a great resource for parents, guardians, and caretakers recovering from substance use disorder. The program aims to teach healthy coping and parenting skills while balancing the needs of recovery.

New FiR facilitators will be fully prepared to implement the program and provide training after attending a two-day session that covers content, education, and implementation of the curriculum. FiR facilitators come together during training to share program implementation experience, ideas, and insights.

All organizations interested in implementing FiR are required to enter into a contract with PFSA and participate in the evaluation requirements of the program. Contracts include ongoing technical assistance, program development, facilitator calls, and assistance with data collection.


