The last days of school are behind us, and carefree summer days are ahead! Kids make many positive childhood memories during the summer months and swimming provides a welcome respite from summer heat – from splashing in pools, playing in lakes, or enjoying time at the beach.

Unfortunately, every year children drown, with one out of four drowning deaths in the U.S every year being a child. Children should never be left unsupervised around water, not even momentarily. Drowning can happen in the blink of the eye, often within 25 seconds of a young child being unsupervised near water.

Family Digital Wellness - Online Cohort Training Program

Apply today for the Family Digital Wellness-Online Cohort (FDW-OC). The training is a unique opportunity for professionals in child and family-serving fields who have an interest in learning about how digital technology impacts communities and discussing how digital wellness can positively impact the lives of children and families that we serve. The FDW-OC provides a way for professionals to come together and expand their capacity for helping families create safe and healthy interactions with digital technology.

This program will follow a cohort structure, with all sessions taking place virtually via Zoom between August 2025 and January 2026:

- One Monthly Group Content Session
- Individual Assignments
- Group Discussions

Families in Recovery (FiR) New Facilitator Training

This research-based program is a great resource for parents, guardians, and caretakers recovering from substance use disorder. The program aims to teach healthy coping and parenting skills while balancing the needs of recovery.

New FiR facilitators will be fully prepared to implement the program and provide training after attending a two-day session that covers content, education, and implementation of the curriculum. FiR facilitators come together during training to share program implementation experience, ideas, and insights.

All organizations interested in implementing FiR are required to enter into a contract with PFSA and participate in the evaluation requirements of the program. Contracts include ongoing technical assistance, program development, facilitator calls, and assistance with data collection.
