# Sherri Irvis-Hill

Sherri Irvis-Hill has been a trainer for PFSA since 2015. In that time, she has trained hundreds of professionals and volunteers on how to recognize and report child abuse.

Sherri retired from the PA Department of Human Services, Office of Children, Youth, and Families after 32 years of public service in various management positions and over 19 years in the child welfare field. Sherri earned her master's degree in public administration from the University of Pittsburgh and resides in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Sherri is the proud mother of two children.

We recently interviewed Sherri, and this is what she had to say about why she is so passionate about training mandated reporters for PFSA.

#### Why do you train for PFSA?

PFSA is a leader in providing programs to help educate and prevent child abuse and neglect in Pennsylvania. Each employee is passionate and dedicated to the families and children in Pennsylvania. They love what they do, and it is seen and it is evident in the advocacy work as well as the new programs offered to help families in recovery and to help educate professionals and communities become aware of the collective responsibility to protect Pennsylvania's children. I train for PFSA because it is my passion and, I believe, one of my purposes in life. I believe children should be

protected at all times and never subjected to abuse. When they are not, they

are subjected to long-term effects like depression, guilt, shame, fear, isolation, and low self-esteem.

### Why do you care about mandated reporters of child abuse?

It's important to me that persons who are responsible for children understand the PA laws around child abuse as well as what can be done when a child is at risk of abuse. It is so rewarding to talk to professionals who will think and do things differently now that they have received training from PFSA.

It is rewarding to hear the personal stories of mandated reporters who are survivors of abuse. I know that I am helping them do their jobs better, and I hope to allay any uncertainties around reporting child abuse. I let them know they are warriors and may be the person who protects that child from death.

We appreciate the wealth of knowledge Sherri brings to each training she provides to mandated reporters. She looks forward to meeting you in her trainings!

## **UPCOMING PFSA TRAININGS**

## Families in Recovery New Facilitator Training

This research-based program is a great resource for parents, guardians, and caretakers recovering from substance use disorder. The program aims to teach healthy coping and parenting skills while balancing the needs of recovery.

New facilitators of the Families in Recovery (FiR) program will be fully prepared to implement the program and provide training after attending a two-day comprehensive session consisting of content, education, and application instruction of the curriculum. FiR facilitators come together to share program implementation experience, ideas, and insights following initial training.

All organizations interested in implementing the Families in Recovery program are required to enter an agreement contract with PFSA and participate in the evaluation requirements of the program. FiR contracts include ongoing technical assistance, program development, facilitator calls, and assistance with data collection procedures.
