# April is Child Abuse Prevention Month Join us in April!

Throughout April, Pennsylvania Family Support Alliance (PFSA) will recognize Child Abuse Prevention Month by hosting several events and activities to call attention to the prevalence of child abuse and how private organizations, public entities, communities, and individuals can work together to prevent and stop it. Children are our most precious resource, and they deserve to be loved and protected and grow up in an environment that is free from abuse and neglect.

This year, PFSA is partnering with the Fred Rogers Institute at Saint Vincent College for two events that help to further the efforts of child abuse prevention in Pennsylvania. The Fred Rogers Institute advances the legacy of Fred Rogers by investing in the strengths of families and caring adults to support the healthy development of children. Fred Rogers established the Institute with the goals of working with current professionals to support their practice in the service of children and families, researchers looking to deepen their understanding of the important issues facing children, and students at the college who aspired to serve children and their helpers.

#### Spotlight Speaker Event

PFSA will host our virtual Spotlight Speaker event featuring the associate director of the Fred Rogers Institute, Emma Lee. She will lead a presentation titled Look for the Helpers, which will explore how children are growing up in a world that exposes them to violence and negativity through online platforms, providing guidance on how we can best talk to children about managing fears and the difficult things they see online. The Spotlight Speaker event will be held on April 4, from 11:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. The event is free and open to the public, and registration can be completed **here**.

## **UPCOMING PFSA TRAININGS**

### Families in Recovery New Facilitator Training

This research-based program is a great resource for parents, guardians, and caretakers recovering from substance use disorder. The program aims to teach healthy coping and parenting skills while balancing the needs of recovery.

New facilitators of the Families in Recovery (FiR) program will be fully prepared to implement the program and provide training after attending a two-day comprehensive session consisting of content, education, and application instruction of the curriculum. FiR facilitators come together to share program implementation experience, ideas, and insights following initial training.

All organizations interested in implementing the Families in Recovery program are required to enter an agreement contract with PFSA and participate in the evaluation requirements of the program. FiR contracts include ongoing technical assistance, program development, facilitator calls, and assistance with data collection procedures.

Certificates are provided to the participants, and, upon request, we will upload confirmation of your training to the Departments of State or Education for CE fulfillments under Act 31 and/or Act 48.
