Each September, there is a movement to raise awareness around recovery and to promote new treatment and recovery practices for those affected by substance use disorder (SUD).

While many treatment services are available, SUD still affects millions of Americans every day. The number of people within the recovery community who are actively supporting one another is also growing, and PFSA hopes to help increase that number each year with our Families in Recovery program.

The **Families in Recovery** program offers a unique opportunity to help bridge the gap between those who are in recovery and in a parenting/caregiving role. We know that these roles overlap and impact one another, creating an increased need for support and education.

This program is person-focused and family-centered, supporting individuals in exploring strengths, needs, and resiliencies. With a trauma-informed approach and the integration of the *Strengthening Families Protective Factors*TM, our Families in Recovery program provides the education, tools, and skills necessary to navigate and balance the recovery and parenting processes.

PFSA provides quarterly training for this program (January, April, July, October) and offers community-based providers and organizations with the training and skills needed to implement this valuable program successfully.


Additionally, PFSA offers support, resources, and technical assistance to ensure a smooth



UPCOMING PFSA TRAININGS

Families in Recovery New Facilitator Training

This research-based program is a great resource for parents, guardians, and caretakers recovering from substance use disorder. The program aims to teach healthy coping and parenting skills while balancing the needs of recovery.

New facilitators of the Families in Recovery (FiR) program will be fully prepared to implement the program and provide training after attending a two-day comprehensive session consisting of content, education, and application instruction of the curriculum. FiR facilitators come together to share program implementation experience, ideas, and insights following initial training.

All organizations interested in implementing the Families in Recovery program are required to enter an agreement contract with PFSA and participate in the evaluation requirements of the program. FiR contracts include ongoing technical assistance, program development, facilitator calls, and assistance with data collection procedures.

Certificates are provided to the participants, and, upon request, we will upload confirmation of your training to the Departments of State or Education for CE fulfillments under Act 31 and/or Act 48. TRAIN-THE-TRAINER

This is an opportunity for organizations to develop their own quality, cost-efficient, in-house training program for employees on child abuse recognition and reporting.
